Active learning, group work, project work, independent work.

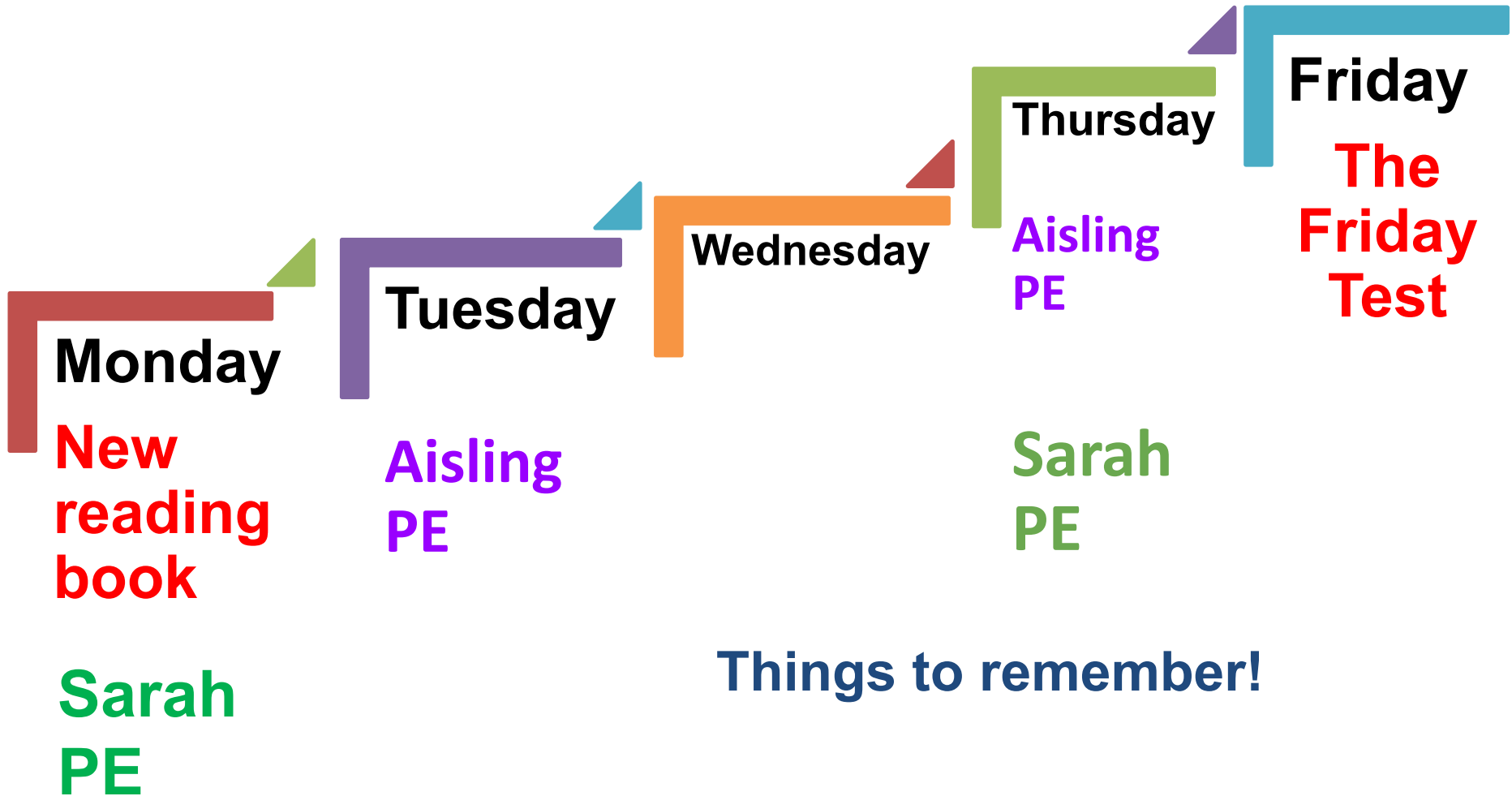

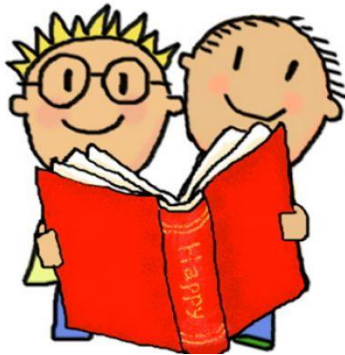

Variety of reasons as to why support teachers may be working with your child.

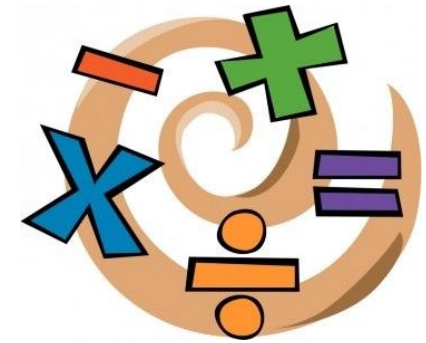




English Curriculum

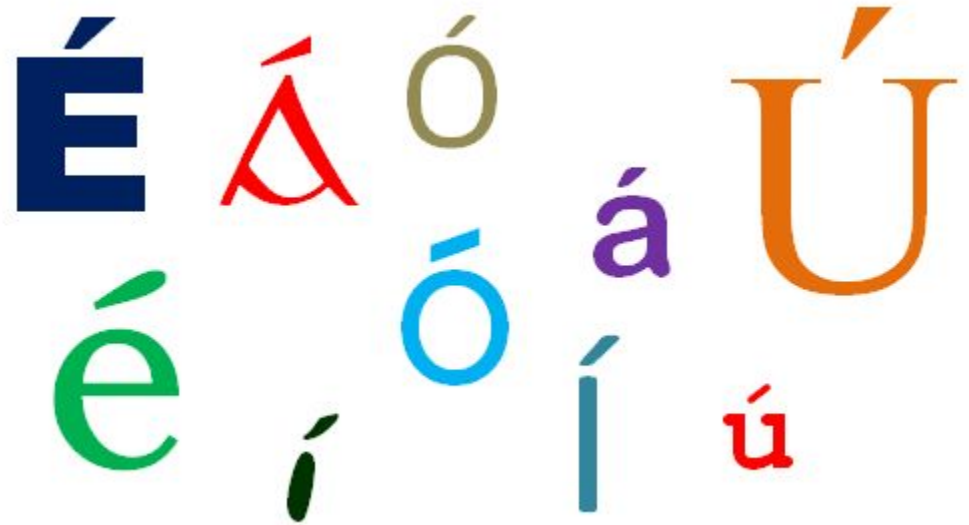

Behaviour Expectations

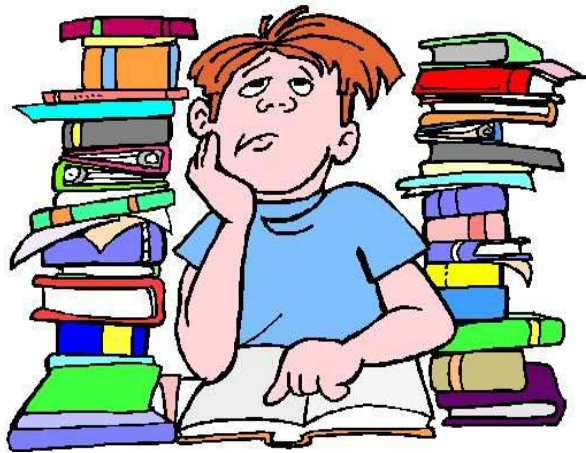


- High expectations of behaviour throughout the school & on yard. Class charters, school rules.

Home Learning

- Given out at the start of the week – it is a standard sheet and if you feel your child is able for more/not able for the amount, use your initiative and alter accordingly. We give a lot of autonomy to families.
- Spellings, tables & reading should be practised every day.
- Should take between 30-45 minutes.
- At the moment, home learning consists of: English spellings, mental maths, tables, and readers.
- We will work toward including Irish spellings over the coming weeks

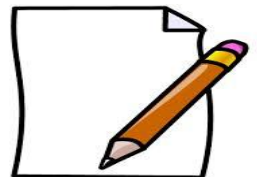
Organisation

- Both in class and at home
- Ensuring your child has all the relevant books and equipment, and that all belongings are labelled.
- Please ensure your child has a set of rain gear and a change of clothes in school, as we will be going outside for yard even in rainy weather.



Punctuality & Absences

- School starts at 8.35am and ends at 2.15pm.
- All absences must be explained by a note – given to the teacher on the day your child returns, or filled out on the website. We are obligated to report on all attendance at various points throughout the year.
